Dear everyone,

I wrote about Easter in the last newsletter and I repeat my greeting that you all experience Easter blessings.

I write this on a special occasion, my 70th birthday. I enjoyed being 60 as I had my teachers' pension, my bus pass and senior railcard. Since then I have passed 65 and received my state pension but 70 is the famous three score and ten but in the words of a Trinity member some years ago, 'it's all downhill after.'

I was very amused by the greeting on the one card which stated that I was 70 but pointed out that was in Fahrenheit and so I am only 21 in Celsius or centigrade as we always called it. That cheered me up and made me feel younger for a while. Someone else pointed out that people were living longer and 70 is the new 60. Underneath it all is the true you. We have just been through Lent, the season when we examine ourselves and remember that we were made from dust and return to dust, a sobering thought indeed. Jesus Himself went through this experience, tempted or tested to be something other than His true self but He resisted.

Sugar Free, Fruit Loaf

A recipe Collette has found and adapted for her own taste buds

Ingredients

350g of dried fruit

200ml of brewed tea, fresh from the pot

50ml of maple syrup

250g of wholemeal spelt flour

2tsp of baking powder

1tsp of mixed spice

2 eggs

Method

- •Soak dried fruit in a bowl with the tea and maple syrup for minimum 3 hours. Preferably over night
- Preheat oven to Gas Mark 4 / 180° or 160° fan. Line 1kg loaf tin with baking parchment
- •Sieve flour into bowl. Add baking powder and mixed spice. Stir. Add fruit and unabsorbed liquid and eggs. Mix thoroughly, then put into tin.
- Bake for about an hour. Once done leave out of oven in tin for 10 minutes, then turn out and place on cooling rack
- Cut to required thickness and slather in butter!!
